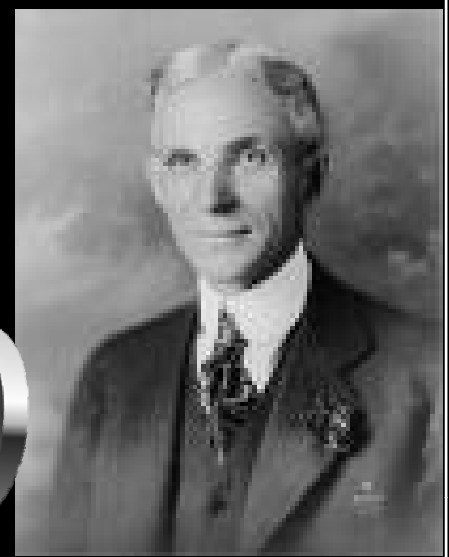


HENRY FORD
