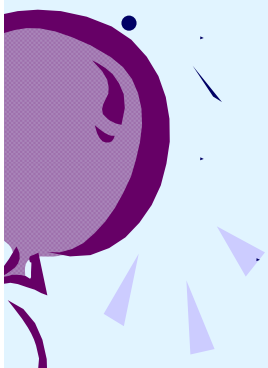
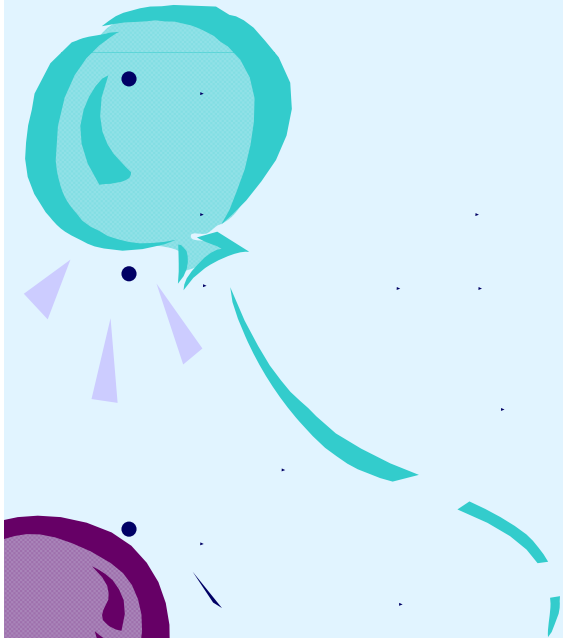
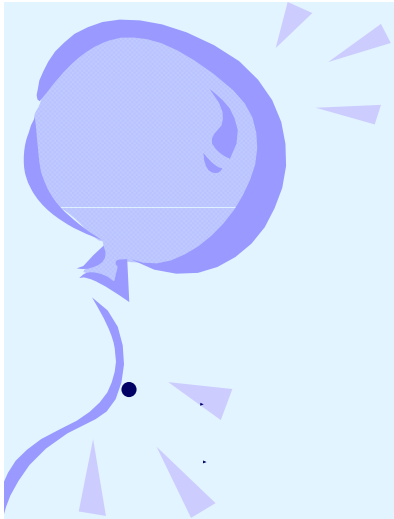
Childhood & Birth

- Scott was not married or had any kids.



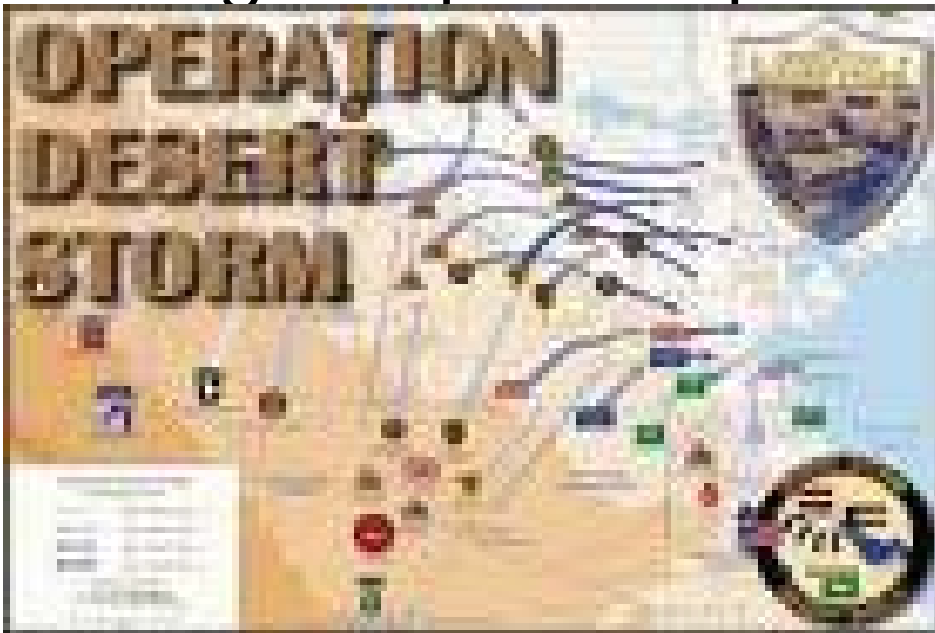
Occupations

- ❑ Scott got a private pilots license.



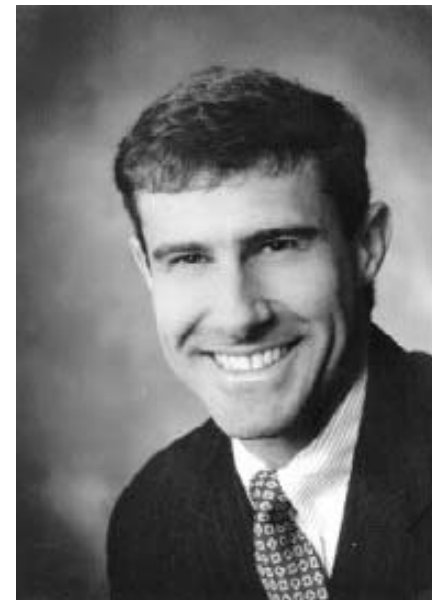


Hardships

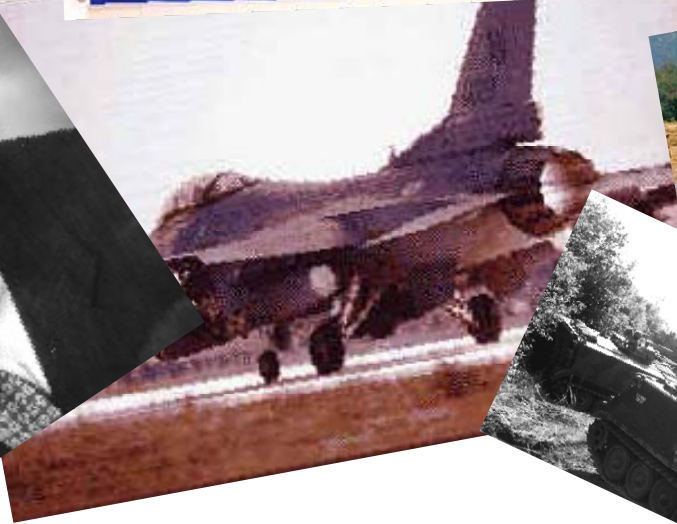
- Some struggles Scott went through was trying to be popular during high school.

- Scott was the oldest out of his brother and sister.

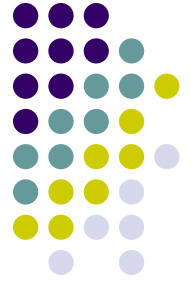
Scott O'Grady
