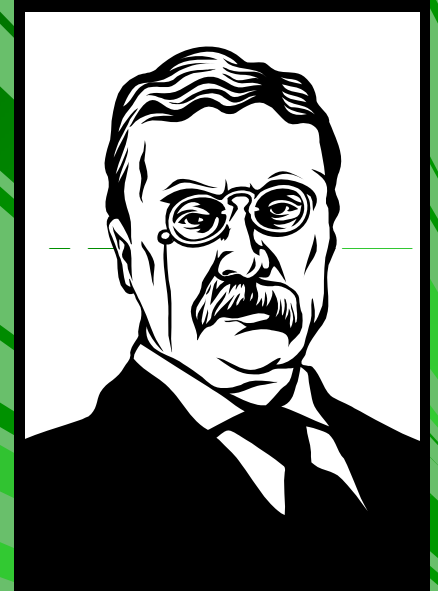

Childhood

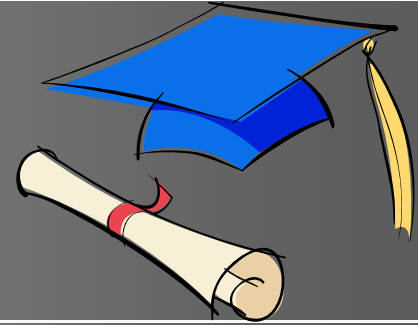
- ❑ Teddy was a sickly child who almost died of so many asthma attacks
